Training Manuals/Distance Learning Modules

The following are substantial works,
designed to be able to be used as *stand alone* resources.

Ethical Youth Work: A DIY Guide for Developing Your Ethical Base (2009), Youth Affairs Council of South Australia, Adelaide. (71pp)

A stand-alone resource for youth workers – suited to work individually, in teams or by organisations. A mix of text and experiential content designed to enable workers to think through issues in a way that impacts on day-to-day practice. Key topics include: What are ethics? What is youth work? Why develop an ethical base? 2 lateral ethical development processes. 2 linear ethical development processes. Practical support and written resources. Current debates and state-of-play in South Australia and nationally.

Human Resource Management in Non-Government Community Organisations (2009), ESSQ, Adelaide. (53pp)

Originally written as a draft chapter for the SACOSS Toolkit (forthcoming), the material has been reframed as a stand-alone resource. This is a largely text-based resource, with a few practical tools and resources appended. It includes conceptual overview of HR policies and procedures, legally-required policies/procedures, other important policies/procedures, staff recruitment and selection, staff management/supervision/support/development and volunteer management (both board and service delivery volunteers). Apart from legally-related material (which is based on SA Law), the document is relevant across Australia. Some aspects are better suited to large organisations.

Working with Women With Lived Prison Experience: A Starting Point (2007), Sisters Inside Inc., South Brisbane, Qld. (190pp)

Working with Women With Lived Prison Experience: An Introduction (2007), Sisters Inside Inc., South Brisbane, Qld. (80pp)

These national experiential learning materials were written for new workers with women pre and post imprisonment. Both include characteristics of criminalised women, understanding daily prison life/culture, issues for women post-release, values and ethics, practical approaches/models, a checklist for a new worker's first month. The substantive kit is primarily designed to accompany training, whereas the shorter version is a DIY version (particularly targeted at single worker organisations).

Working with People with Disabilities: NCSS Social Service Fundamentals Program for Vocational Staff (2003), National Council of Social Service in conjunction with Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (53pp)

This kit was written for new workers in the disability field. The handbook focuses on case studies, resource materials/video reviews and values-exploration questionnaires.

Participatory Human Relations Management: Class Notes (2003), Ministry of Community Development & Sport in conjunction with Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (73pp)

This material was written for experienced aged care workers, returning to study to upgrade their skills in preparation for entering organisational management. The handbook covered: organisational culture & ethics, approaches to leadership and communication, staff supervision and development, team building, conflict management and change processing.

BM0418: Working with the Disadvantaged & Disabled: Class Notes (2003), Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (137pp)

This was a full semester module for 2nd/3rd Year Diploma in Community Services Management students. Part 1 focussed on exploring values/beliefs about disability and disadvantage, and linking these to different practice frameworks. Part 2 was more information-focussed and covered visual, hearing, physical, developmental, cognitive and psychiatric disabilities.

BM0413: Community Services Program Management: Class Notes (2003), Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (68pp)

This full semester module for 2nd/3rd Year Diploma in Community Services Management students, used a model based in Participatory Action Research to plan, develop, implement and review a program. The notes combine PowerPoint lectures and practical resources and exercises. It also provides guidelines for undertaking an (assessed) practical program within the community.

BM0417: Volunteer Management: Class Notes 1 – Context of Volunteer Management and **BM0417: Volunteer Management: Class Notes 2 – Practical Volunteer Management Skills** (2003), Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (55pp & 60pp)

This was a full semester module for 3rd Year Diploma in Community Services Management students. Weeks 3-7 (*Class Notes 1*) focussed on understanding government policy, possible motivations for volunteering and exploring different values-approaches to volunteer management. Weeks 8-16 (*Class Notes 2*) were more functional, looking at key tasks – recruiting, supervision, training, policy etc.

BM0419: Community Work Field Practice: Basic Tutorial Notes (2003), Nanyang Polytechnic, Singapore. (20pp)

This was a half semester module for 2nd Year Diploma in Community Services Management students. Notes summarised basic material on helping skills – definition of helping, impact of helper on client, values, principles of helping, attending skills, listening skills and an introduction to a more comprehensive model.

The Action Research Resource Kit (1997), Commonwealth Department of Health and Family Services, Canberra. (57pp)

This kit was written for pilot programs funded through the Prime Ministerial Youth Homeless Taskforce. Pilots were required to integrate action research into their process as a means of both improving their practice and generating data for the Taskforce's deliberations.

A Coordinator's Companion to the Panic Stations Report (1997), Port Youth Theatre Workshop, Adelaide. **Co-authored with Susan Ditter.** (17pp)

This was designed to sit alongside *An Evaluative Report of Panic Stations* (see *Research Documents* section). It provides a practical guide to implementing a major community arts project of this type, and includes the context required, involving police, involving the Aboriginal community, working across youth/arts sector cultures, staffing, funding, the artistic process and (ideal) stages of development.

Groups in Youth Work (1994), Aboriginal Study Centre Program, SA Department of Employment, Technical and Further Education. (194pp)

Understanding Young People (1993), Aboriginal Study Centre Program, SA Department of Employment, Technical and Further Education. (137pp)

These were the experiential text for Units of the same title, which were part of the Advanced Certificate in Community Services (Youth Work). The documents were particularly targeted at Aboriginal External Studies students in remote communities. An *Assessment Booklet* and *Answers Booklet* were also produced.

Trainers Manual for NSW Youth Accommodation Workers' Induction Training, Modules 1 - 3 (1992), for NSW Youth Sector Training Council, Sydney. (85pp)

Contains *Learning Outcomes* and *Program Outline*, and resource materials for trainers and participants, for a total of 10 units. These are grouped into 3 modules - *The Context for Interaction with Young People, Some Approaches and Skills for Intervention with Young People and Generating a Positive Work Environment*. (The Manual was later integrated into a wider package by YSTC.)

YWK2235: Helping Skills in Youth Work (1991), Edith Cowan University, Perth, WA. (141pp)

This is the external studies text for the Unit of the same title, which is a 2nd Year Unit in the Bachelor of Arts (Youth Work). The unit text was accompanied by a **Plan** handbook, pre-formatted **Journal** and substantial **Readings** which are linked with the text throughout, which were also compiled by S. Quixley.

Introductory Trainer Training (1991), ESSQ, Adelaide. (91pp)

A compilation of notes on Trainer Training, which were used as a base resource in a range of trainer training settings. Includes handouts on: *Features of Effective Training, Planning Training, Some Training Techniques* and *Delivering Training*. A *Resources List* is appended.

Research for Planning Youth Programs: A Resource Kit for SkillShare Projects (1990), Youth Sector Training Council of SA, Adelaide. (48pp)

Another self-directed resource, which looks at a number of different research processes with a focus on those which can be integrated into the existing functioning of an agency. Includes: *Thinking about Research, Community Research, Action Research, Using Existing Research Data, Involving the Project Community in Research* and *Bibliography*.

Administration and Management: 12 x 2 hour Training Sessions (1988), WA College of Advanced Education, Claremont. (78pp)

A trainer's guide to conducting practical sessions using mainly experiential learning techniques in key areas of local organisational management/administration. Topics covered include: programming, planning, budgeting, bookkeeping, management styles, reports/submissions, staffing, media, networking, committee procedure, committee resourcing and business writing. A bibliography is also included.

Community Development and Youth Work (1988), WA College of Advanced Education, Claremont. (48pp)

A collection of course notes divided into three main sections: *Research and Youth Work, Issues and Processes in Community Youth Work* and *Community Youth Work and Social Change*.

A Group Process Handbook: Notes for the Unit (1988), WA College of Advanced Education, Claremont. (94pp)

A combination of course notes and process outlines. The first half of the manual provides a compilation of material on *Group Theory and Process*; the second, step-by-step outlines of a range of *Experiential Group Processes* which can be used to cover the material.

The Helping Skills Handbook (1988), WA College of Advanced Education, Claremont. (57pp)

Section 1 looks at various *Ideological Perspectives* on 'helping' and critically analyses the role of the helping professions. Section 2 proposes a model for 'Non-Blaming' *Problem Solving* and outlines the skills required to operate within the model. Section 3 looks at the area of *Crisis Intervention* at a theoretical and practical level.

The Study Skills Handbook (1988), WA College of Advanced Education, Claremont. (91pp)

A very practical guide for students entering higher education. Designed to be more *user friendly* than much of the available material, it concentrates on understanding the university environment, preparing to study and participating/presenting material in class. Material on research and writing is also included, along with practical exercises to demonstrate the skills required.

Write It Right!: A Writing Skills Handbook (1988), for WA Health Department, Perth. (40pp)

This handbook formed the basis of a series of workshops for community nurses conducted during 1988. It was also written in a manner that makes it close to a *stand alone* resource. It includes practical and theoretical material on formal writing skills, with an emphasis on report writing.

Affecting Your Future: The Handbook (1983), and **Affecting Your Future: The Report** (1984), SA Department of Agriculture. **Co-authored with Deborah McCulloch**. (62pp & 46pp).

The Handbook is a collation of handout material for participants in a full weekend program covering personal and community development skills. *The Report* is a trainer's guide to conducting the program.

Youth Link Basic Training Course, 1982 (1982), Youth Link Inc, Adelaide. (150 pp)

A detailed package covering all aspects of a 16 x 2 hour program, focused on teaching basic telephone counselling and information provision skills. The full package includes *Trainers' Notes*, *Participants' Handouts* and alternate teaching material.

Introduction to the C.I.T.Y Programme: Trainer's Outline (1983), SA Department for Community Welfare, Adelaide. (11pp)

A trainer's guide to conducting a 6 session program of group work and community work skills for aspiring youth workers.

It also looks at including the option to extend the person's *frame of reference*, rather than simply working from *where they are at*. This publication includes a critique of existing models, overview of this model, explanation of each circle of the model, skills/process checklists and information on further resources.

Quixley, Suzi (1995), **8 Participatory Training/Learning Methods**, ESSQ, Bowden, SA. (30pp; ISBN: 0 9587640 3 4)

This is a collection of detailed process outlines for 8 methods. Each is particularly suited to use in *Experiential Training/Learning* settings. The publication is targeted at people with existing training competencies, although the methods themselves can be applied in non-training setting. Methods detailed are: *Brainstorming, Cumulative Images, Dot Voting, Group Norms, Photolanguage, Straw Voting, Visual Planning* and *Web Charts*. Most sections include details of steps for using the method, risks associated with the method, hints/ideas, and variations on the method. There is also a long checklist of methods that can be used to achieve various functions (eg. processing learning, decision making, giving input).
